What to expect

Love Lanes Festival is a large event to showcase music, food and activities.

Love Lanes Festival is managed and produced by Central Coast Council. The event is free.

When: Saturday 7 February 2026

Where: Wyong CBD (1-11 Alison road, Wyong)

Times: 4pm – 9pm

Music and food

Music offers a wide range of performances by artists. There are multiple stages throughout the streets. You will be able to discover and enjoy music together.

There will be a variety of food and dessert stalls at the event. You will need to purchase food.

There will be big crowds surrounding the food areas. I will need extra time to move around and to buy food.



Crowds

There will be many people in Wyong CBD for the event. It can get very crowded.

Hidden disability Sunflower Lanyard

Love Lanes Festival supports the Hidden Disability Sunflower. The lanyard is a way for me to indicate to event staff that I may need extra support, time and understanding.

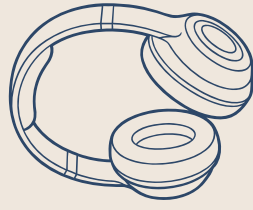
It is ok if I don't have a lanyard, I can still get help when I need it. Look out for Central Coast Council Event Staff wearing the 'Event Staff' shirts.

Driving and Road Closures

Some roads will be closed. There will be lots of traffic on the roads that remain open so I should allow extra travel time, or I can catch public transport.

The following temporary road closures will be in place from 6am until 11pm.

- **Alison Road** (between Pacific Highway & Margaret St)
- **Bakers Lane** (between Pacific Highway & Rankins Court)
- **Rankens Court**
- **Peters Lane**
- **Hely Street** (between Plaza Lane & Alison Road)
- **Robleys Lane** (between Pacific Highway & Hely Street)





Car Parking

Car parking close to the event will be busy. I might choose to leave my car at home and catch public transport.

If I choose to drive, roads might close while my car is parked. Cars aren't allowed to drive on closed roads or exit car parks on closed roads unless a Police Officer says it's okay.

Wyong train and bus station is a 200 meter walk from the event site. There is a clear pathway from the station to the event site.

Wyong train station has 12 accessible parking spots in the carpark.



Facilities Available

- Accessible toilets
- Accessible viewing area
- Auslan interpreter at the Main stage for the MC
- Sensory space
- Water re-fill stations
- Free earplugs for noise protection
- Accessible parking located at Wyong train station
- Accessible drop off zone
- 200 metre walk from Wyong train station to the event site with a clear line of path

Service animals welcome

I can bring my certified assistance animal. They must be on a leash in all parts of the event site.

Safety

Love Lanes Festival has a First Aid tent located at the entrance of the village central carpark. If I am feeling unwell or if I have hurt myself, I can find help at this tent.



What if its Raining?

Love Lanes Festival is an outdoors event. Please be prepared for all weather conditions and bring a raincoat, umbrella, or spray jacket.

Public Safety is our number one priority and should severe weather conditions be experienced there will be communications via the [Central Coast Council Facebook page](#).

Sensory Information

When I visit Love Lanes Festival, I might come across different sensory experiences. These include:

- Loud areas
- Announcements that come across through speakers
- Music through speakers
- Flashing lights on the stage

Quiet Space

If the crowds, noise or bright lights feel like too much, I can step into a quiet spaces. Staff will be there, ready to help, creating a calm and comfortable retreat where I can take a break and reset. The quiet spaces is located at the Rocking The Senses van in Robbleys Lane.





Who to ask for help

Event staff

Event staff can support me with wayfinding, directions and communication during the event. I can bring a support worker or companion if I require hands-on assistance such as wheelchair pushing, side by side support or trained assistance.

Event staff will be wearing navy blue shirts that say 'Event Staff' on the back.

Event Information Booth

At this booth, event staff will be able to provide event information and answer my questions. This will be a black marquee on Alison Road labelled 'Event Information'.

There is an accessible viewing area located on Alison Road, in front of the main stage. I don't need to book seats for the accessible viewing area.
