Set between Kincumba Mountain Reserve and the Kincumber Broadwater, Kincumber is a charming coastal town with strong ties to its boat building past.

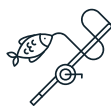

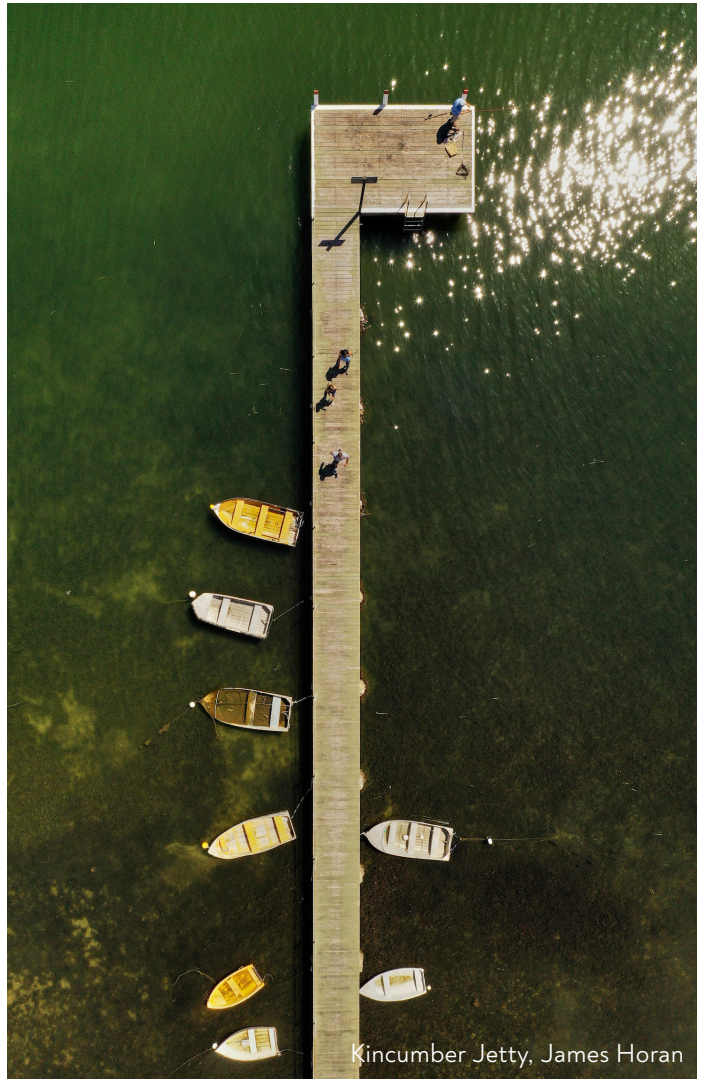

Kincumber Bucket List

- **Cafes with history.** Kincumber was one of the earliest settlements on the Central Coast, with boat-builders making it their home. Kincumber's post office, operating from 1945 to 1990, has been revamped into a dog-friendly cafe where you can soak up the area's history over a coffee.
- **Hike up Kincumba Mountain.** Kincumba Mountain Reserve is one of the largest preserved rainforests on the Central Coast. Explore the reserve's trails to find caves, palm groves, wildflowers, Aboriginal carvings and axe-grinding grooves, then stop for a lunch break or family BBQ at the top of the mountain in sheltered kiosks.
- **Warehouse wonders and brewery.** The industrial soul of Kincumber - courtesy of its shipbuilding heritage - is showcased in the quirky modern businesses operating from warehouse spaces on Cochrone Street. Stop by for a coffee and lunch, pilates or a beer at the brewery.
- **Playtime and a family feed.** Kincumber's indoor sports centre is a colourful place for kids to play, with dedicated soft-play areas, inflatables, toys, cubby houses, swings and bike ramps. Parents can sit on the sidelines while enjoying a snack at the cafe.
- **Scenic Drive highlights.** Along the scenic coastal road that connects Kincumber to popular seaside towns Avoca Beach and Terrigal, you will find several boutiques and cafés worthy of a pitstop. Admire fine artworks at the local gallery surrounded by bushland.
- **Blooms and bites.** From freshly made pastries and local seafood to crispy bánh mì, café favourites and classic pub meals, Kincumber makes it easy to find something satisfying to eat. Drop by the local florist for market fresh flowers to brighten your day.
- **Walk, cycle or skate Kinny's parks and reserves.** Explore Kincumber Broadwater by walking the Kincumber Jetty. There is a children's playground at Broadwater Park, with the picturesque waterfront to cycle along, as well as skating facilities in Frost Reserve and South Kincumber recreation area.
- **Explore Davistown waterfront.** Kincumber is well connected to nearby Davistown where you will find bustling restaurants, bars and clubs overlooking Cockle Channel and Brisbane Water, it's an awesome spot for enjoying a Friday night sundowner, meal and entertainment.
